

My dear Dr. Lane:-

Oxford, 6 Sept., 1903:

Perhaps the following will interest you. It is the inscription on the gravestone of the Tradescant family (for one of whom, the founder of the Botanical Garden here - or rather, its first gardener - I suppose the genus *Tradescantia* was named). This garden is also of interest as being the first piece of ground in England set apart for the Scientific Study of plants. The grave was in Lambeth, but the stone is now in the Ashmolean Museum with part of Tradescant's collections. It was erected 1662.

Know, stranger, ere thou pass, beneath this stone
lies John Tradescant, grandfather, father, son,
The last dy'd in his Spring, the other two
lived till they had travell'd o'er land and nature thro',
As by their choice collections may appear
Of what is rare in land, in seas, in air.
Whilst they (as Homer did in a nut)
A world of wonders in one closet shut.
Those famous antiquarians that had been
Both gardeners to the Rose and Lilly Queen,
Transplanted now themselves, sleep here, and when
Angels shall with their trumpets awaken men,
and fire shall purge the world, these hence shall rise
And change their garden for a paradise.

Repaired by Subscription 1773.
