

Dear Mrs. Crane:

Pontresina, 17 June.

I was pleased to get your card as was my mother to hear from Mrs. Crane. We have been in this pleasant mountainous days. It is pretty cold as we are almost 6000 ft. above sea and there are snow-covered mountains and glaciers all around. Yesterday I went up to the top of the Bernina Pass (7600 ft.) with fine glacier and peak scenery. Browsing here is very exciting. One finds almost in the valley 'Hochalp' plants. The tree-line is here 7200 ft. (higher than in most of Switzerland) and it is really a tree-line, very sudden, with absolutely no transition into scrub. The trees are *Larix europaea* and *Pinus cembra*. A few names (perhaps a trifle boring) will give you an idea of some of the pleasures of collecting here:

Oxytropis campestris, *Hieracium uniformis*, *Androsace glacialis*, *A. chamaejasme*, *Sibbaldia procumbens*, *Papaver aurantiacum*, *Gagea boottii*, *Pinguicula alpina*, *Drosera aizoides* (yellow), *Anemone nemorosa*, *Ranunculus pyrenaeus*, *Primula integrifolia*, *P. glutinosa*, *P. latifolia* (true fine purple spp.), field flowers with *P. farinosa*; *Soldanella pumila* and *alpina*, *Gentiana lutea*, *G. alpina*, *Pedicularis sibirica*, *P. acutiflora*, *Bartsia alpina* (*passim*), *Polygonum bistorta*, *Saxifrage stellaris*, *Orchis mascula*, *O. coriophora*, *O. maculata*, *O. militaris*, *O. monia*, *Rhamnus pumila*, *Alchemilla* spp., *Saxifrage exarata*, *S. rotundifolia*, *S. cizorum* (*passim*), *Thesium* spp., *Salix retusa*, *S. herbacea*, *S. reticulata*, *Florydia scotina*, *Cotoneaster integriformis*, *Anemone alpina* (yellow), *Ajuga pyramidalis*, *A. genevensis*, *A. reptans*, *Arabis alpina*, *Plantago alpina*, *Globalaria* spp., *Cypripedium* a ground flora, *Bupleurum gallicum*, *Tetragynanthus siligerius*, *Anterius rumicoides*, *Tofieldia calycata*, *Coccoloba uvifera*, *Gymnadenia conopsea*, *G. odoratissima*, *Daphne striata*, *Vaccinium officinale*, *Aponogeton* spp., *Asplenium septentrionale*, *Dianthus caesius*, *Luzula* spp. (1) *Selaginella helvetica*, *Clematis alpina*, *Valeriana* spp., *Dryas octopetala*, *Orchis ustulans*, *Convallaria majalis*, *Potentilla* spp., *Ranunculus alpinus*, *Lonicera nigra*, *L. xylosteum*, *L. alpigena*, *Hornungia alpina*, *Potentilla* spp., *Stellaria nemorum* — and so I might go on indefinitely. The greatest show here is made by *Primula farinosa*, *Trollius europaeus*, *Viola austriaca*, *V. montana*, and, of course, *Ranunculus*. These names may help you to reconstruct present conditions here. I'm glad to hear that Moore is a member of the Club. I think he deserves to be, but am too blind a member myself to take responsibility of proposing him. With best regards to Mrs. Crane and yourself, A. S. P.
