

Randolph, 4 July, 1915

Dear Mr. Drake:-

Greetings to you and Mrs. Drake from Lois County! I have been here about ten days now, and all has gone well except that Huri-etta has had the measles from which she is recover-
ing nicely and is now practically well. She ac-
quired them in Boston. Do you find Carex
peninsularica in Shelburne? We have had the
var. lucorum from a few places but none of the
type from the county till I got some here near
my home a few days ago. It may be that I
have overlooked it, but it is a plant with which
I am pretty familiar so it would hardly seem
possible. I should be glad if you could turn it up.
New notions for Carex bromoides, Arcautho-
bin, Poa debilis, Carex arca, etc. are
among recent finds. Tomorrow I hope to make
another trip to Lost Lotion and to Dalton to
see what I can turn up, and later one to
the Stewartstown region, which is rather rich.
At the Herbarium, as I think I wrote you, we did
all your plants except Rubus and the sterile Spar-
gania. Our time didn't hold out for anything and
we had to leave in the midst of Rubus. Still we
cleared up a fair number of difficulties. We
couldn't convince ourselves that there was much in
h. L. F.'s recent segregations in the Stellaria bo-
realis group. Give our kindest regards to Mrs.
Drake. Also to Mr. Jack Knight and Mr. Horny, if they
are in Shelburne. Hoping to see you later yours, A. J. P.
