If so it is a new station. I have done less collecting this season than usual, but I hope to pick up a few things tomorrow. Dr. Tuckerman and I have discovered on Mt. Middle Mountain some day. It's the only one of the range we have not yet been on. Dr. Harry P. Nichols of here who has been here told me the other day a good story of Ambrosador Bruce and a race fair at the Crystal Cascade which remind me of all you when I see you. Best regards, A.P.
