Dear Sir

I have mailed, with that letter,  
the Vascular cryptogames I had collected  
in my last trip. I had collected in  
all 18 species of ferns but some were  
well known and common species,  
I sent only those that were of  
interest to you. you can keep all  
the specimens, and if you want more  
I can send you in exchange of some  
few ~~of ferns~~ I have not in my collection.  
— I have included several Difformity of  
the anciana mexicana, supposing  
they will prove of interest to you.  
no 4 is maybe something new, as no.  
16. — When I collected no 5 it was  
under the impression that it was  
the same Cheilanthes leucopoda found  
in that region!

 16 *Selaginella* affinis. — on the  
 Summit and base of the  
 San Geronimo, June. — Flare and  
 15 *S. rupestris* — on rocks (bank in the spring)  
 Burnet and Flare Co. May 1900.  
 14 *Selaginella* *rupestris* — granite rocks  
 on the base near Shaw, June  
 13 *Manilia* *bracteata*? — along the river  
 near Shaw Co. May.  
 12 *Charakteris longimanus* — on the  
 rocky top of mountains in Marble Co.

- 6 *Nothotena dealbata* Hungerford — exposed  
 rocks — near San Saba. Sept. —  
 Canochus peak and cretaceous mts  
 between the Brazos and Colorado.  
 7 *Ancima Mexicana* Vahl. — rocky ravines  
 and shaded rocks in mountains — upper  
 seco, June — common in Hondo  
 seco, and Sobinal Canons (world's)  
 also on San Geronimo and Helote  
 creek (Burn Co.).  
 8 *Pellaea pterocarya* Link. — shaded rocks.  
 — House Mt. May. — common in the  
 rocky regions <sup>West</sup> of Colorado to near  
 Mexico.  
 9 *Wrightiana* Hook. — granite rocks. —  
 House Mt. (Flare Co.) — common  
 in granite rocks in Flare and Burnetts.  
 10 *Asplenium parvulum* Hook. & G. —  
 shaded rocks. — upper Guadalupe, June.  
 — Canons of San Geronimo.  
 11 *Polypodium cyathiferum* Baker  
*Chelanthus (alabamensis?)* — exposed rocks.  
 — San Geronimo creek June. —

~~seen from gutter~~ as a *gall* for each  
 (Beer Co.) — left of water on the  
 upper shore and twice between Mt  
 river and old note and *Paratanaisius*  
 2 - Harker, Id. — House Mountain May  
 (Beer Co.) — left of rock (gravel)  
 3 *Chilanthus* *Leidenensis* Hook. — House  
 Mountain (Beer Co.) May. — left of  
 gravel rock. — Beer Co. July  
 4 - (Lemon Co.) — left of rock (gravel)  
 from Mt. May. — also near there  
 on *metamorphic* rock.  
 5 *Paratanaisius* *concolor* Hook. — extend rock.  
 Safford and Bruce Canyon (Wash. Co.)
