containing 87 specimens of the larger duplicates of European  
mosses either for your own collection or that of some minority-  
whichever you think best. I am glad to learn that you have been  
putting the Scleract mosses in order - No! I did not know it! -  
We shall be glad to loan any mosses from Maine as that State  
is least represented in my collections of any in N. England.  
I am particularly interested in the true Hypnum of the  
Hypnum or Stenodon group (H. nobile - fertile - paleoceras)  
including H. Jamesii which is not a Rapidoetopium  
also the latter group (H. recurvum, H. laevipetulum, H.  
clavatum &c.) But any will be welcome - all but musci
