In reply to your favor of 2nd inst. I beg to inform you, that the book enumerated in my catalogue 1842: 2683 Jäger at Sumbell. Genera et species Muscorum &c. 2 vol. Cum 2 suppl. et indices is a copy of the original publication taken from the "Berichte über die Thätigkeit des St. Gallischen naturwiss. Vereins"

There is no other work besides the Genera and Species Muscorum. The book mentioned by M. B. D. Jackson in his "Guide to the Literature of Botany" on page 153 (Jäger, Iconographia, Berlin 1870-75) is the first volume of the above, which Mr. Jackson has quoted - I believe - from an obsolete catalogue (1877) of a Berlin second-hand bookseller, where the work of Jäger, continued and finished by M. Sumbell under a title a little altered, has not been ~~completed~~ complete.
