In reply to your favor of 2nd inst I beg to inform you, that the book enumerated in my catalogue 1842: 2083 Jäger at Saarbrück. Genera et species minusculae. 2 vols. Cxxv 200pp. et index is a copy of the original publication taken from the "Berichte über die Tätigkeit des St. Gallischen naturwissenschaftlichen Vereins".

There is no other work besides the Genera et species minusculae. The book mentioned by Mr. B. D. Jackson in his "Guide to the Literature of Botany" on page 153 (Jäger, Actinuratio, Berlin 1870-75) is the first volume of the above, while Mr. Jackson has quoted - I believe - from an obsolete catalogue (1877) of a Berlin second-hand bookseller, where the work of Jäger, continued and finished by M. Saarbrück under a title a little altered, has not been completed complete.
