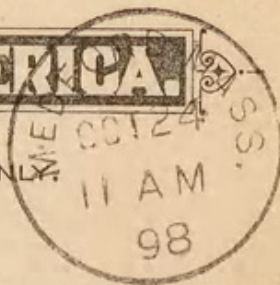


Dear Mr Collins Oct. 24 98

prevented me from examining ferns. #1. is a form
of *Botrychium* that I have had under consideration for
the past two years from the Desert but have not been
able to determine positively yet. Have had it from V.C. for
12 years or more & kept it with B. mat. Hook. Eatoni.
Collected it last season & thinks it new. Have you any
larger or more highly developed specimens? 2. appears
to be 'abnormal' filix femina. How much of it did you
find, and did you ^{but} rootstock? 3. *Asplenium* - near *lunatum* -
- *lunatum* - 4. ~~*Asplenium* - near *lunatum*~~ *Asplenium* - look
like *Adiantum* *nigrum*. Yours truly
