but, ^{as} their descriptions are
not wholly clear, it is

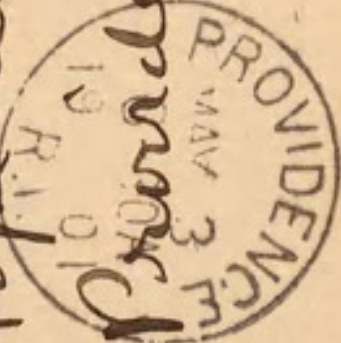
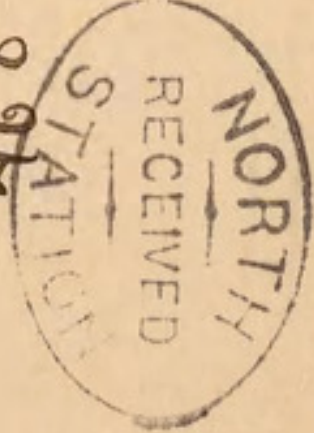
