Dear Collins:

Fernald was here
Sunday & on Friday
eve May 3^d would do
for our miss list. so I
hope you can fix it to
spend a considerable
portion of that day
here & we can go over
the whole matter. If
you would like to have
Mr Chamberlain here too,
it would give me
pleasure to see him.
I am expecting to hear
your report soon on the
flies. I sent you.

I have a *Fissidens*, Fernald
brought from wall of
North Basin that appears
to be *osmundoides*, but
with rather smaller cells

than usual. You have the *Melchioria* double
starred but is it not the same moss as in Austin,
Musci Appal. from Mt Washington?

Fernald proposes to have in his list only
plants from Depot Pond & above. If we
follow the same plan it would exclude my
Meekera, & *Leucodon* & *Dichelyma* which are
all from a lower level. I quite agree with
you to call the list a "preliminary" one
your letter of yesterday has just come with the drawings. I
have no doubt now that my *Die. falcatum* is var *Eatonii*
of *fuscescens*; and the *Hyp. palustre* also I shall call im-
ponens after seeing yr figure. I have been comparing
the *Mnium* & tho' it has no fruit the cells are too small
for affine, too large for *cuspidatum* & in fact suit best
in measurement the *rostratum* as given in Dixon. Therefore
you some of it. It is mixed with *pinetatum*, and in
fact the teeth are often abt. obsolete on young shoot leaves.

I have found in the mosses Mr Faxon gave the N.E. Bot Club
very good *Hypnum montanum* fr brook on side of Cannon Mt.
Profile Notch N.H.

I find in my Herb *Mnium rostratum*
I collected in Alpine Garden Mt Washington 23 June 98 that
agrees well with the Katahdin specimen. I send you a
map that has come fr Capt Rogers, "one for each member of the Botanical
party" — I suppose you have the var *Eatonii* in fruit. I have
just been looking at mine & appear to have plenty in fruit
