

The *Chiloscyphus* which I offered last Sept. turned out to be *C. polyanthus* instead of *C. pallescens*. Since then I have found the true *pallescens* so I have sent you both varieties. They look very similar when sterile. Dr. Evans has examined duplicates of both specimens.
