My dear Mr. Collins:-

I find when I come to label up
some of my plants that you and Fernald
did not calculate upon enough labels for
me. I have run short on the plain
Carleton labels about 70 and on the
Incasdigash Point about 35. Fernald told
me that he had some duplicates of these
and when he is well I shall try to
get them. I think it would be safest for
you on the next lots to give me at least
 $\frac{2}{3}$ and perhaps $\frac{3}{4}$ as many as you do him.

Then if that proves too many, we can
reduce the number as the later ones.

I send this to you at once to
catch you, if possible before you point any
more.
