My Dear Dr

I wrote you not many days ago. Three weeks since I left M. Vade I started out for an excursion in Monte Libano & M. Yoro. I spent a week in the former finding but few plants & a week in the latter without having a chance to do so on account of the rains almost daily. I made but one excursion. I found what looks like a Ranunculus - n. fl. or fr. & a small Phyllanthus with 4-androus fl. Is that anything unusual? Just as I was about to leave Potosi - my stopping place in Monte Yoro - for another estate farther on Mr Revet - my present host - came along on his way home from Saltadero as it was part of my plan to come here if time & circumstances should allow. I concluded to do so at once & with his company & guidance. I am so very comfortable here that I am staying longer than I intended & may stay longer than I ought. But I have not nearly finished my excursions as planned out. There are

present our fatigues, all around us not  
so easy to climb as you might imagine  
I was on them today - got wet & dirty you  
had better believe! But I found novelties. I  
got a second sp. of that Rubiae, with very  
long greenish fl., an anomalous sp. of  
<sup>(for the first part)</sup> Hippocrate, with rather conspicuous yellow  
fl. the filament quite free & with a thin  
cup-like disk. — a Pisouria new to me.  
In days past I have found quite a number  
of novelties, among others a sp. of Dorstenia.  
the fourth I have found - the third was  
collected in San Juan de Buenavista  
I have added another palm to my collec-  
tion. So far as I can judge I have specimens  
of every sp. I have seen except one. That is  
going about Bayama but I can't get  
it - or did not at any rate.

I have collected also a variety of  
shells. Perhaps I may augment my  
small earnings by selling some of  
them. What do you think of the prospect?  
I send you some little soap for  
lack of anything better.
