

Morristown Oct 24th 1861

My Dear Dr

There is a vessel - the Ira - at
Guantanamo. I have packed up all
my plants - 10 good bales - and shall
take them down in a day or two for
shipment. There is besides now there
the coll. from Mayari of summer before
last. The packages are marked "B. Wess-
ermann & Co Bookellers N.Y." So you
will know when to send for them on the
receipt of my letter. The distribution of
them will keep you out of idleness I ex-
pect. It seems to me we ought to have some-
thing more from Lund, by this time.

I am afraid of any thing comes
from Eaton it will be just in time
to be of no benefit - after I am off
for Alabama when I am pretty well
resolved to go as soon as the roads
become passable. They are horrid now.
But the rains are ceasing apparently

During my last excursion in Monte
Voor I found a new Lythaceous
plant - new genus perhaps - certain-
ly different from anything in Ind.
I enclose a scrap & you will get plenty
when you get the rest. I would call
it Gloriosopsis collaris. It is a
bush 15°-20° high. I've seen but
one. There is a similar looking bush
abundant enough in one locality
low down on the Ganges river
but I incline to think it is not
identical. The spec. are packed up &
I could not compare. Neither is it spic.
The accessory teeth, ^{of the last one found} form a sort of collar
slightly lobed & reflexed. Day after
tomorrow I take my coll. to Sel-
lador. I will then add whatever
may be necessary to say further in
a P.S. Yours truly Chas Wright

Stramonium. Then is a report that ^{the leaves} it
kills cockroaches & my friends want
to try its efficacy.
Nov 3^d We have the papers to the 15th all
It rains every day "for cantans" & the
road are not "mudable" that don't expire
it but "malissimo" or "infernal"^{na} as
I heard it expressed yesterday.
I took my coll. to the village as above.
They will go on the Dina within a few
days I hope.
If the weather don't dry up soon I
shall grow far on orange & id Cura
Can you send me in a letter a map or
maps of the seat of war? L.W.
