

Mataanzas Aug 15th / 65

Dear Dr.

My dried plants are deposited with Leay to be sent by the first good chance to Boston. Tomorrow early I shall see that they are boxed up in good order and then I go to Fernina to look after Lundbeck who I am told is sick and that he had ~~off~~all. As soon as possible I shall continue on to Habana and thence to Friend Blaine.

The plants are thrown into families according to the "Tabular arrangement" given by Grisebach in his Introduction. But they will be in two series. Those collected in the *benago* form one series those dried since in Palma del & de Juncal another. It will be but little labor to combine them. In the first collection there may be a few unarranged — the last of those dried previous to my going to Mataanzas.

I send you Morales' "*Gastrococo armentalis*" Please keep it for me in "my pigeon-hole" It is ^{suppose} *acrocomia lasiospatha*. I believe I wrote you that I might send you a lot of my observations of Cuban life. If you have time and inclination read it & forward to my brother. I put in also some parcels of mud for Sullivan. Please forward them when convenient.

If I have omitted a half dozen things and badly written others please charge it to the account of the weather which is excessively hot and sultry. I don't know how I stand it. I want to get where I can fling every thing but pants & shirt and let things hang loose outside.
