Dear Chamberlain:-

I recently received from V. F. Brotherus his fascicle IV of the Bryotheca Pennica. In the letter accompanying the package he asked me to send you \$1. 60 and the balance to him. Accordingly I am doing this.

Everything going on about as usual here. A few warm days but remarkable few so far for the time of year. George and Edie have just moved out into the country again. They had to get out of the Cypress St house as the owner wanted the place himself. They are out in Johnston nearly out to North Scituate, directly on the Danielson car line. George has to begin work in Olneyville car barn at 6 o'clock in the morning, before any cars come in and he is finding it pretty difficult to manage it I guess. Don't know whether he can stand it or not. Their address is, I think, R.F.D., Olneyville, R.I.

My older brother is still in poor health. Father is pretty well for one of his age (84) although he is becoming gradually blind and very deaf.

I spent the week end of the 4th on a motorboat down the bay with Mr. Hope and his family. Had a very good time but ate so much that I had to diet for a couple of days afterwards.

Am wondering just where I ought to address this letter. Upon second thought I believe I will not enclose the check until I hear just where you are.
