yet unsold.

5. 12/3/53 N.Y. looking for vessel for Leguina.

- 8 4/25/56 Phila. See Miss Morris
- 9 4/26/56 Gets barometer, watches & views & money from Dr.  
McJannet & makes preparations to return to Venezuela

Fuchsia rubra.
- 21 5/9/61 no acc still at Shaw
- 22 8/12/61 reflecting on the civil war
- 23 8/11/62 sends seeds acknowledges pamphlets
- 24 6/8/63 speaks of going into peach orchard & to  
still at Mr. Shaw, at 600 per week
- 25 10/28/63 still completing of Shaw & still looking  
out for land - now in Ill.
- 26 11/10/63 learns Mr. Shaw in 'quit' about coming to farm

- 27 St. Louis 2/7/64 gives acc. of purchase of 33 acres woodland at Allenton Mo.
- 28 St. L. 3/5-64 - Declines offer to go to Cambridge
- 29 Allenton 3/20/64
- 30 " 6/9/64 accepts Dr. Hays' offer of curator at Allenton
- 31 " 6/23/64 Dr. Hays lets him off & he then declines
- 32 " 6/5/65 another similar offer from Dr. Hays + information desired.
- 33 " 6/21/65 again accepts curatorship
- 34 " 6/28/65 offer somewhat changed + again declined
- 35 " 7/9/65 offer again changed to \$30.00 per mo + board lodging + fuel + accepted
- 36 " 3/15/66 Was evidently here past but has returned + becomes a correspondent of Allenton
- 37 " 4/2/66 Recv. Dr. Hays + Torrey's pictures
- 38 " 8/24/66 gives results of the curating in house of Composites plant !!

- 43 Wilmington 7/23/74 gives an acc. of his settling out in Mexico + going to Germany + return; then about getting his book published + some Delawarean items.
- 44 Me - 11/18/74 Defends his book + is willing to wait.
- 45 " 6/15/75 Still as above
- 46 " 7/28/76 compares Notaea + Podophyllum + speaks of collecting in Trinidad!
- 47 " 10/28/76 Still talking of Trinidad - has sold home but not his book - eyesight better

- 49 " 5/6/77 Has been very sick - announces leaving  
 for N.Y. in 10' sailing.
- 50 Port of Spain 6/17/77 Describes his arrival & impressions,  
 quite like me to me
- 51 " 9/20/77 Gives number of ferns collected  
 rather informative as to temperature &c
- 51<sup>A</sup> " " 11/24/77 much as in letters to me
- 52 " 4/26/78 Gives acc of shipment of 50 sets of ferns,  
 and then the familiar acc of the search for  
 counterfeit money by police.
- 53 " 6/25/78 Still on the counterfeiting question
- 54 " 8/26/78 Principally speaking of ferns & rocks,
