Dear Dr. Standley, -

In reply to your letter of December 14, permit me to say that I showed your letter to Prof. Ames who seemed to think it would be well to have Mr. Austin Smith collect orchids for him, and I shall write at once to ask him to communicate with Prof. Ames ^{who is} in Florida for the winter.

With regard to the subjects of the Peruvian orchids, this matter has been necessarily set aside by the large ^{Bremer} collection of Costa Rica, ^{Miscellaneous} by numerous collections from various parts of the world, by routine duties, by proof-reading and lately by reclassifying the our herbarium -

lawsuit evolving from an auto-
mobile accident and a slight minor
operation on my face before long,
I anticipate tackling the Peruvian
orchids very soon. In this connec-
tion I might mention that we
have received from you and from
the Gray Herbarium numerous addi-
tions to the ^{Peruvian} flora since my ^{active} work
in this field some time ago.

to return to me, at your convenience,
the ^{early} portions of my manuscript, at
~~your convenience~~, in the light of
recent literature.
