These changes, of which I think that I ought to have been notified as well as Mr. Greenleaf, obviously make much of the matter of my last letter to you inapplicable at present. Mr. Greenleaf urges me in view of these changes to send out no more copies of my circular. My duty to the member of my household and my guests, who were injured through the negligent management of the Garden, having been discharged by the protest I have made, I am perhaps under no obligation to busy myself further

with the affairs of the University.
But if I should be obliged to send out
any copies, for example by requests for
them, I shall note these changes
upon them.
