Dear Dr Kennedy

I must not longer  
delay fulfilling my  
promise to Mr. Boning to  
write and tell you that  
he expressed regret at  
not being able to see  
more of you, and to have  
~~also~~ had an opportunity to  
talk with you about the  
plants you collected in  
Canada. But he felt  
himself under the restraint  
of obligations that made  
him not master of his  
own time and he expressed  
a fear that he might not  
have given you ~~too~~ much  
attention as he ought to have

done. He regretted also  
that he could not make  
time enough to get out  
to see you.

I was unable myself to see  
him long enough to get all  
the information that I wanted  
about his ferns. But with  
a large undistributed collecting  
awaiting his return home he  
felt obliged to hurry back.

I want also to apologise  
myself for the hurried  
postal which I sent to you.

I was very busy when the  
thought of it came into my  
mind, and I sent it off  
almost mechanically without  
a thought as to how I was  
doing it.

I have been so very busy that  
I have not yet had time to

select out the ferns & papers  
which I have for you  
but I hope to get or them  
before very long.
