Dear Mrs. Horner:

Mr. Faxon and I returned home last evening, after having had a delightful visit at the Bald Pate Inn. Thanks for your letter and map. We succeeded in finding the Caulophyllum, which was growing in great abundance, and was in full flower. We secured specimens both for ourselves and for the Botanical Club of the Herbarium. It will give me pleasure to keep you posted as to what the Botanical Club are planning to do for our New England Herbarium, and it may be that some of your specimens would be very acceptable to them, as your name is so frequently mentioned in the Essex County Flora that your specimens would have special interest for the Club.

We were very sorry to think that through your eagerness to receive us hospitably, you should have had an attack of your asthmatic trouble, and I hope you will not think it presuming in me if I send you, as I propose to do tomorrow morning, two bottles of my Prairie Weed: a medicine which has been quite serviceable in many cases of asthma, and has relieved much spasmodic suffering where people are troubled with that disease. I trust that you will accept them with my compliments, and give the medicine a trial, for, to say the least, it cannot do you any harm, and I shall be so glad if it perhaps relieves you.

I have been so much interested in tramping about your neighborhood that I shall hope to come again, and if it is not inconvenient to you I may perhaps call, but do not feel obliged to see me if you feel in the slightest degree indisposed.
