My dear Mr. Kennedy:

This forenoon I mailed to you your set of my N. W. Montana mosses, of about 90 species. I was able to make up only six full sets like this. And I am persuaded that several of the species in this set will not be distributed again very soon. I wish I could afford to distribute them gratuitously.

The \$3.⁰⁰ I have offered them for are principally designed to defray expense for labels and pockets. It is likely that I shall be able to send you a dozen or so more species after everything is cleared up. Then I shall be pleased to present to you.

Please let me hear ^{from you} after safe arrival of package.

I am pleased to see you on the committee for the Bryological Memorial meeting. I expect to attend this year. And you may depend on me for two or three type specimens, and for other material that may be desired.

I shall hope to be able to entertain the Bryological Section, privately of course, with the set of photos which I have arranged to exchange, as you see by my recent circular. You must not fail me yourself.
