The violet of which you send
a leaf & flowers is I think, without
doubt V. papilionacea. The flowers are
not well developed; & this I believe is
the reason why the hairs seemed
knubbed. Look at the field grown flowers
& see if this appearance has not
largely disappeared.

My English violets are in fine bloom;
so is V. rugulosa in the garden. The
~~rest~~ are yet to flower, but the plants
look well.

You may see me down in June to
examine flowers of Blackberries. Hope you
& Mr. Rich can go off on a short trip.
