Rueby in S. A. and find them very heavily
duplicated. 51 nos. are named. - All the
preliminary and mechanical work I shall do and
may have to invoke your help or Prof. Eaton's for
the uncertain ones and Mr. Baker for the new species.
The American Association meets here in New York Aug.
10th-17th. are we to have the pleasure of seeing you
