I notice in your interesting "fern notes" in the March Rhodora a little error which it seems best to call to your attention.

Asplenium montanum is stated to grow on "limestone cliffs". This is contrary to my experience in this county which comprises the first Conn. stations discovered for the fern in question.

In The Fern Bulletin, Vol. VIII pg. 18 you will find a short account of what was known about the fern in Conn. at the time the article was published.
