My Dear Sir:-

All your critical notes will be systematically taken up at the earliest possible date after things are settled at the Museum, perhaps in the course of a month, and the corrections made. There will probably be a number of points to correspond about. The first steps were taken yesterday looking to the installation of the botanical specimens and the establishment of a department of botany.

Mr. Filling referred your letter to me and I had a short list
