I have been very much disturbed

since you left there, as I remembered
that before you went I quite
forgot to hand you the letters
of introduction which I had ready
for you. I sincerely hope

you made some pleasant
summer acquaintances in spite
of my stupidity.

I was very tired at the end of
the year and left Cambridge
with a great many things -
Jerusalem Botanical Socy, Alstead
School, &c, on my mind, and
now on coming back find the
letters which I never gave you.

I have some interesting New
Hampshire things to show you
- 35 new to the State as I work it
out, including a new hybrid
between Carex rostrata and
gracillima or aristata, Sauricula

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gyparia and trifoliata, ¹⁸⁹Spiranthes
latifolia, Liparis hiliifolia and
Rhododendron canescens, Dou,
a very distinct thing, the same that
Miss Day got in foliage on Mt.
Yoninox last year and which
puzzled us so.
