The enclosed blue-print gives a fair idea of the *Aspl. ebenum*, but does not quite do it justice as I remember the specimen. This is marked "sterile" as you will observe. It is my recollection that it is much thinner in texture than most specimens of *A. ebenum*. You will remember that it was also found on limestone. I should like to know what you think of this. You may keep the print.
