Pollard and William Palmer of the National Museum - The latter two having a leave of absence for two weeks so we went on a botanical excursion to Cuba, to collect in the Province of Santiago de Cuba. Commencing at Baracoa thence to Santiago - St Luis and above As this province had been but little botanically visited before we hope to have some good and desirable specimens - we have between four and five hundred entries. The sets will be made up at once and all the plants will be determined before the sets are delivered. And should you wish for a set you shall have as complete a set as possible. We are compelled to charge ten dollars per hundred owing to the cost of collecting the plants.

Many thanks for reviewing my list of new species - Ferns & grasses was not included. I hope some day to visit Cambridge to thank you in person for the many favours received from you and your associates
