GRANTS, MAJOR GIFTS, AND LOANS

ADA Compliance Grant: The Los Angeles County Chief Administrative Office granted \$175,000 to The Arboretum for improvements towards ADA compliance.

J.P. Getty Preserve L.A. Grant: The Arboretum was recipient of \$63,500 from the Getty's Preserve LA Grant program. Funds will be used to develop a plan to ensure the integrity of our historic buildings and expand public access. A Preserve LA implementation grant will be applied for upon completion of the plan.

Warren and Alyce Williamson underwrote an art exhibition, "Cross Pollination" for \$25,000.

Jameson Grant for \$20,000. A portion of this grant will underwrite the Japanese Iris Festival and the Mediterranean Gardening Symposium, as well as to publish The Arboretum's newsletter and calendar.

The Stanley Smith Horticultural Trust awarded The Arboretum \$20,000 for the purchase, installation, and training required to upgrade our plant record-keeping software to an international standard.

Valley Crest Tree Company, one of our corporate partners, donated \$25,000 toward completion of the stone pathways in the Herb Garden.

Three sculptures were given to The Arboretum on long-term loan by sculptors Bret Price and Jerry Walberg. Both artists have global reputations and have offered their contacts to expand our collection. A recently formed sculpture committee will advise on future policies regarding such art objects.
