the show which is open 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. from Dec. 1 through 9. Yule logs and other holiday items will be featured at a Christmas boutique in the Gift Shop. Proceeds from the show and boutique will provide part of the \$10,000 which the Guild has pledged to contribute annually for support of the Gardens.

The first Sunday in December will open "Holidays in the Garden" at the South Coast Botanic Garden in Palos Verdes. The week-long display of Yuletide exhibits by local garden clubs, plant societies, and individuals in Frances Young Hall will give visitors ideas for home decorations and an opportunity to shop for unusual presents. A cup of coffee and a home-made pastry at the "Wassail Bowl" will make a fitting finale for the visit. The Palos Verdes Symphonic Band, conducted by Richard Schwalbe, will entertain at a Christmas Concert in the Garden at 2 p.m. on Dec. 16.


BROMELIAD SOCIETY HEAD

T im Lorman, staff horticulturist at the Arboretum, will assume his duties as president of the Bromeliad Society in January. For several years he has been active in the society, two years as second vice-president and the three previous years as a member of the board of directors. He has also served as bromeliad hybrid registration chairman.

Mr. Lorman will have a demanding schedule during his two year term as president. On a recent trip to New Orleans, La., he attended the ceremony at which newly trained bromeliad show judges received their certificates. In May he is scheduled to visit the world bromeliad conference in Orlando, Fla.

During the time he is not at his job at the Arboretum supervising the nursery and greenhouses, Mr. Lorman gives talks about bromeliads to garden clubs and plant societies. He will also be on hand at the Arboretum open house in Oc-

tober. These lectures support the primary public function of the bromeliad society, which is educational. "Basically, we are trying to get more and more information and books available to members and potential members," said Mr. Lorman. Current publications of the 3,200 member society include a bromeliad glossary, a cultural handbook, and an international checklist of bromeliad hybrids.
