A new and unique garden of Japanese iris will be unveiled the weekend of May 13 and 14, 2000 during The Arboretum's inaugural Japanese Iris Festival.

The iris collection, developed by the world renowned Kamo Nurseries in Japan and made available to The Arboretum from the Donald M. Kendall Sculpture Gardens at PepsiCo's world headquarters, includes over 35 varieties of *Iris ensata*,

the largest of all iris. Some flowers reach 12 inches in diameter with lovely forms, colors and patterns.

Centuries of intensive cultivation by Japanese collectors and hybridizers have brought this iris to its present state of magnificence. Kamo Nurseries started over 100 years ago in their cultivation and are the principal source of Japanese iris today.


JUST FOR KIDS
