Descanso Youth Education is reaching out. With Tak Niija's leadership, the La Canada Schools are undertaking a new summer program called Science Outdoors for grades 6, 7, 8. Forty children are enrolled and with their teachers will meet every morning 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. at the Hospitality House for six weeks. Two mornings every week, Tak will conduct a field study trip up the Conservation Trail into the mature chaparral. On alternate days they go with their teacher into Native Plant Garden or up Nature Trail and do classroom projects. It is certain that these boys and girls will have an altogether new concept of watershed values and the balance of nature.

Tak also has a smart 9 X 12 greenhouse in operation with heater - cooler and humidifier, and has constructed cement slabs at greenhouse entrance, and garden gate on which he has built a 14' work bench with laundry tubs for washing and bunching vegetable and cleaning tools.

Summer classes are nearly filled, though there is room for some of your 12 to 15 year-olds in Patio Gardens and in an all new Jr. Museum course which will do some renovation of the Nature Museum.
