that you doubt the if the corolla
of Krinitzia leucophæa is ever
yellow. So far as ^{the plant} ~~the~~ we collected
on the Mojave side of the San Bdo
Mts. is concerned, it certainly is
yellow, the more recently opened central
flowers light yellow, & the older ~~suber~~
outer ones darker. At a distance it
might almost be taken for Myrsine
asperum.

We are having a long, dry spell &
vegetation is backward. I hope the
California trip holds -
