My Dear Gray

Many thanks for your kind letter and for the honor  
done me in the new genus "Ostrya" - I could have waited  
until 2 letters deserved it. Surely you never found me in the mood  
to take any thing from you otherwise than kindly - I don't know  
however, what I should have said if my name had been applied  
to that ugly, serrated thorn, bark of Thunber finding. I will  
thank Thunber for his agency in the creation of the new genus  
and beg a specimen from him or somebody else.

You spoke to me relative to a Gardener Anderson who  
now acts as Gardener for Geo W Chapin of this City in Princeton.  
The most enthusiastic Florist and successful Cultivator of  
green house plants of any of the Gardeners of this vicinity.
