Dear Sir,

Your favour with the Drawings came safely to hand and I will now engrave those for you and also those for Mrs Gray, whom I have also addressed by this mail, as speedily and in as good a style as possible, and forward the proofs to you with the original drawings.

I have received from Germany, by some of our newly arrived friends some lithographic stones.

I should have liked to be informed whether you intend to have the printing work of your Drawings done in Buffalo or in New York; the printers generally don't like to print only the proofs if they are not promised the whole job. Of the first Stone I will have the proofs printed in Buffalo and then send them on to you immediately.
