Dear Sir,

The box contg. your paper has arrived in Buffalo on the 18th inst; it has been long on the route but was not so promptly forwarded as you mentioned.

I received also the proofs with the originals and will attend to the corrections required, I enclose the proofs of the last two plates. Shall I not in future in engraving the plates replace the analysis so that it would correspond with the numbers in successive order? I had to do so in the engravings for Mr. Martins in the old country.

In your last letter you order 400 copies on sized paper, but in a former letter you mentioned but 200, is it your intention, to have 400 copies struck off but only 200. coloured?

I received from Mr. Sullivan of Columbus O. a letter enclosing a few lines from your good selves and I send him to day the proof sheets ordered.

Mr. Endicott sent me 8. Stones of different sizes wghg abt. 500 lbs per Rail Road Express, for which they charged me \$20.- Freight. I had ordered the Stones but not given any instruction to send them by so costly a conveyance. I wrote to him abt. it and he answered that as the mistake had been made by his Carman, he would make a deduction of \$10. from his Bill;
