Dear professor.

We are just back off our trip in the S. West of Texas. We could not go as far as we had projected to. nevertheless we have explored a very interesting country, the whole basin of Llano river and most of the mountainous region that form the headwaters of Guadalupe, Medina, Cibolo, Hondo, etc. Sabinal a region that has been (if you're well informed) neglected by botanists - in proof of that I will expose the following fact: Lindheimer some forty years ago, found in the neighborhood of Fredericksburg a rare fern in the Anemia Mericana, & since no botanist has collected it in Texas.

Well I found it quite interesting in some
ways as I think it's quite a good
example of how the economy has changed
over time. It's also interesting to see how
the government has responded to different
economic challenges. The chart shows that
there was a significant increase in the
unemployment rate during the Great
Depression, which is reflected in the
high levels of poverty and income inequality.
The government's response was to increase
spending on social programs like welfare
and unemployment benefits, which helped
to stabilize the economy and reduce
poverty. This is a good example of how
the government can play a role in addressing
economic challenges and improving the
lives of its citizens. Overall, the chart
