I will write you more fully about the Engelman reprint from St. Louis. - we go tomorrow. Dr. Eng's idea was to place the 50 copies on sale at the herbarium, on some arrangement similar to that for Syn. Fl., if you will kindly undertake to handle them. I believe that we decided to sell them at \$10.00 each, in sheets; but I should like to confer with Mr. Shaw before they are offered for sale.

I return the Ceanothus box by express, prepaid, and trust that it will reach you in good condition. I have gone over the specimens several times, very carefully, and do not see how I can improve on your arrangement except for one or two trifling changes in sequence of species; but C. dentatus is, to my mind, closely enough related to fragiliflorus to warrant its insertion after that species. What I have called Parryi will doubtless prove to be Veitchianus, but I must leave the comparison with icons to you; I hope to hear from Parry on
