Dear Watson.

You see I have made a sudden change
of base - everything in the botanical line looks so
promising here that I think I shall make a stay
of it as long as it seems desirable. I have sent
for Mr. Parry to come down from Cotton so please
use the above address till otherwise advised.

The steamer following me comes down the impulsive
Jones. our meeting was quite a joke. He is active &
lively no his way generally bringing 3 or 4 in ship with
him. or "New to California" "More Jonesii" We now talk of a
trip together into Lower California if we go far enough
we shall get good things. Cleveland is a good useful man
but physically weak - I shall have to wait for
Nemocaulis, but it will come in due time.

An interesting red variety of mine is Ophioglossum I suppose
G. vulgatum but it looks green and reminds me of a
figure in Hook's Fl. Bor. it is not sufficiently advanced but I
say it is abundant every where on the table land associated
with Dodecatheon & Carex Parryi. Cleveland is naturally excited
about it & has sent a note to T. J. C. Bullitin.
I collected the same in spring of 1850. in my collection

has ever lost in crossing the Isthmus, and never had
a chance to look for it again till now. I suppose there
being an unusual good season makes it more conspicuous.

Mr Cleveland has called my attention to the duckfooted
Palmette shrub which he says he has noticed every year
but never seen in fl. it is evidently a Frankenia
and I suspect F. Palmeri & please compare with Palmer
specimens. It is abundant here and I shall make it
a point to get it in fl & fr though I would like that.
Mr Cleveland should have the credit of the discovery.
The season is very backward for a month. all the
better for securing the early flora. Jones expects to go
up the coast in about a month. he now thinks he
will not finish up California Nevada Oregon & go to the
Sierra but confine himself to California. He is a queer
fellow but very good company.

I expect to go up to Lassen when the R.R. is finished
which goes on slowly. Not so and yet of Pringle. He
may have changed his route or delayed on the way.
I am surprised at the improvements here. I make
me feel old to go back 32 years & see the changes. I
begin to feel like a Veteran.
