Dear Doctor

Herewith I beg to submit to you the paper which I propose to use for the Lichens of Cuba.

I reckon of the specimens proposed to be now issued 20 sets of about 140 nos; & about 30 ~~nos~~ ^{number} species over, of which there are only from 2 to 10 specimens each. A ream of paper of the size sent will more than serve therefore, and if the appearance of it suits you, I shall send for it at once.

I have affixed to the outside the kind of ticket I incline to adopt, and send also one of the capsules of the Lindig collⁿ to compare.

There will need to be about 6200 copies of the ticket printed - if a loose one is put inside with the specimen - or 3100, if the outside ticket fastened to the capsule is enough.

Will you kindly tell me about what
the tickets will cost, on white paper?
I wish to save Mr Wright the
expense of issuing the collector, but
do not desire to spend any more
than shall be required to give the
collection a good appearance. I
enclose also a more expensive paper
but do not know that anything
will be gained by adopting it, and
it is not near so strong, as the
Manilla, of course.

The specimen may be put up
in sheets of the same paper, as
you suggested, after being secured
in their capsules.

Thank you for the very interest-
ing & valuable paper from Littmann,
which I wished thrice as long.

up the second part of the work,
to be issued hereafter.
