& accompany other's collections.

collectors here, and it would be
better if mine did not ^{come after} contain
all the rest.

Thanks for the addresses, Dr. Gray
also gave them & our barices are dis-
patched to Mr. Boott.

Our grapes are not heard from yet.

I fear some trouble as we sent
the large package about the time of the
holidays when there were so many
bundles flying. 'Too bad!' We know
nothing of Arizona grapes, yet.
