Dear Watson, Let me again thank you for help from your library and herbarium.

I want a description of Oxalis Deppei. Urban refers to it (Berlin Bot. Jahrb. III. 243) O. esculenta of Gordon. The latter is described by Otto & Dietrich Allg. Garten-Zeitung III (1835) 388. Urban refers to O. Deppei also O. Schaphylla, Link v. 1862 t. 11, (non Cav.). I have no recollection of the Allg. Gart. Zeitung in your library; in that case you will not probably be able to help me. My plant differs from plate of Loddiges by oblong-rhomoidal lobes of 3-foliate leaves &c. (I enclose a few leaves). Perhaps Link or Otto's plate, or that in Sweet Brit. Pl. Gard. 1831. 96, would agree with my plant (acanthocarp).

From the herbarium I would be glad to have for comparison specimens of Myrodia (except M. turbinata); also any Mexican or Cent. Amer. specimens of Styrax.
