I have made a close calculation on my Umbellifer paper, comparing with the Proc. Am. Acad. "Contributions," & it will take nearly 110 pages.

There will be 10 plates, like those that were published in the Gazette, except that they will consist only of front sections.

These plates we will have prepared for printing, so that presswork need be the only expense. Mr. Faxon is to prepare them.

I would be very glad to consider this paper a Contribution from the Gray Herbarium, as much as the Hypericum paper. It would be perfectly fair to call it such, for

it most certainly originated there, was constantly assisted from there, & the consultation of types there was like putting the foundation stones under the structure.
