

The last letter, from Sir Wm. !

July 12. 1865.

Dear Dr. Gray
Dr. Hooker is away in
Yorkshire. I have been
using my best endeavours
to procure you seeds of
the (so called) English or
small-leaved. A fortnight
harmless are produced abund-
antly with us, but a ripe
seed never to my knowledge.
We indeed wrote several
nursery men in England &
in Scotland who profess
to have them in store: but
they had none: so at
length I obtained them
from France. They look

perfect, & I hope will
prove so.

I paid into for
seph's hands the money
for C. Wright: - & wrote
to our Consul at Havan-
nah: - but I could not
tell the Consul where to
find him: - for I do
not know whether he
was yet in the U. S. or
in Cuba, or in some
other of the W. Indian
Islands. I hope the
Consul may be of some
service to him. Our
affectionate regards
to Mrs. Gray.
