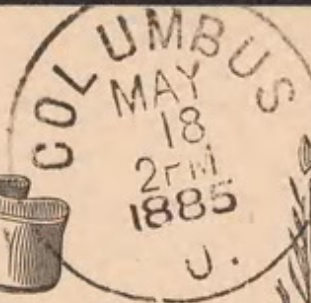


My dear Sir. Columbus O. May 18 / 85.
