My Dear Sir

Your letter of April last has been on file for a long time - I have not been able to reply before having been mostly absent from home - Of the 800 sent me I have not been able to dispose of but two copies although when ordered there were five or six engaged in conformity to the schedule sent out by Dr Torrey & yourself before you transferred the work to your publishers Two of the individuals flew off in consequence of the increase of price & the rest from the profane of the times - Of the four copies unsold I will make whatever disposition may be deemed advisable - If there appears any prospect of better times I should think that as they are safely here it would be the best plan to let them remain a while longer - But unless otherwise directed I will send them to White next winter For the remaining two copies I will settle at the same time Of course you need not in future send but two ^{No.} ~~copies~~ of the remaining part of the work

I suppose that you are hammering away at the flora - It turns out to be a most unpropitious time for those most interested in its publication

I am all anxiety to see the 2^o No of II Post
Mr Curtis informs me that you have a Prinopis
Chapmanii in it - I suppose it is that plant we have
called a Lindelia. In looking over your account
of Liatris I do not find any mention of one which
has always appeared to me a good species & which I
have usually distributed doubtfully as L. revoluta.

I have done nothing in the way of Botany this
season - My hands have been tied with other business
I however accidentally met with the Ruellia
humistrata, Mr. which to my knowledge has not
been seen since the time of the old Frenchman.
It is a near kin to R. blaugentia with much
smaller flowers than any other American species.
