It grows up the river but not here. I think you will find something in my No in N York that I took to be that & in my view quite distinct from *E. Fortis*. However do as you like - its your fight

As I used to see *E. cuneif* it was a tree 2-3 ft or more branching with broad cuneate leaves. & text is low (12-18') simple except to form a compound corymb & growing in clusters. I wrote to Katie & told her & Mr C what you said (you & Mrs Gray) Thank you both for my share & same to you
