Dear Professor,

By this mail I send you
a package of plants collected by me in this
County last year. I should have sent the
plants before, if I had not felt too
unwell to attend to the matter.

I hear about come to the
Conclusion not to send any plants to
Mr. Darius Watson, nor to Cambridge during
your absence. I have sent Mr. Watson
a considerable number of new and rare
plants, and have never received any recog-
nition from him. He has been very
generous in acknowledging the labors
of the Parish Brothers of San Bernar-
dino, and has done them the justice they
deserve. It is not necessary

that I should submit to this treatment,
nor send to him, ^{nor send to him}
and I do not propose to do so, unless
his policy towards me is changed. I have a small collection

of Grasses & rushes from this County,
collected in 1881, which I can send
to some one willing to name them.
